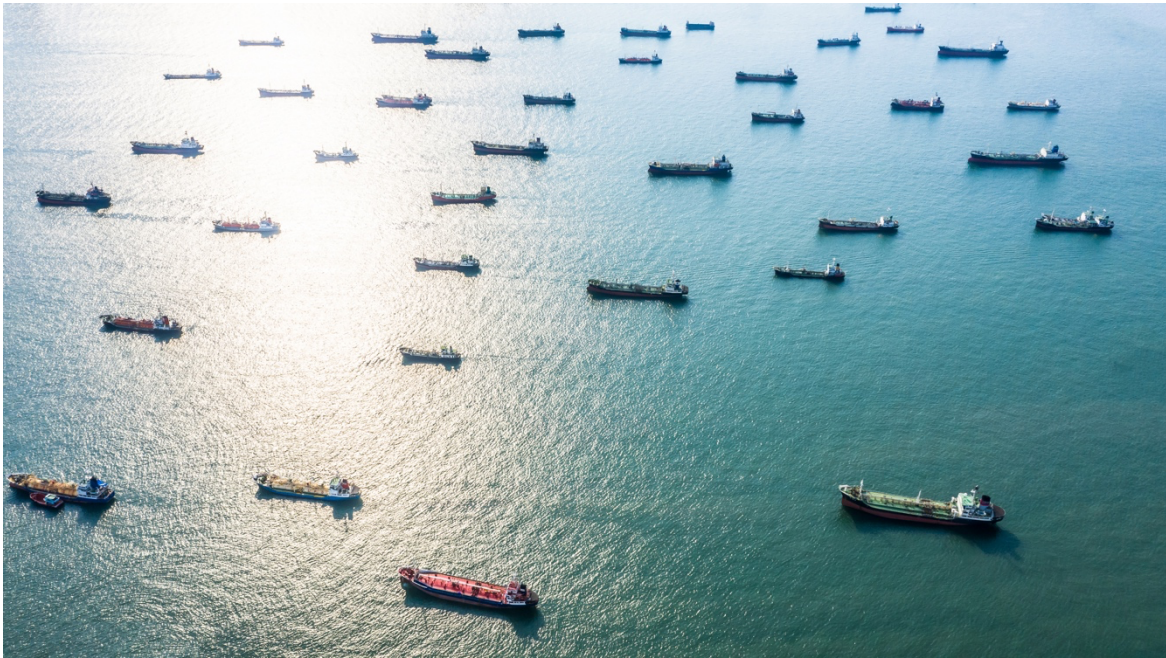


East & West Coast Delays



Ports, Rail Terminals, and CFS locations are experiencing severe congestion and prolonged delays. Due to the substantial increase in imports, lack of available truckers, and equipment shortages, these delays are expected until spring of 2022.

The Worst Areas in the U.S. at Current:

East Coast

Record cargo volumes are being recorded each month at all U.S. ports. New York / New Jersey Ports are operating at capacity, while other ports are suffering and diverting cargo. Delays are to be expected. Current estimated containers on anchor outside of Savannah is 80,000.

- Philadelphia: 3-4-day vessel wait time
- NY/NJ: 2-3-day vessel wait time
- Savannah: 7-10-day vessel wait time - Carriers are advancing cut-offs with little notice
- Port Everglades / Miami: 3-6-day vessel wait time - High import volume causing a CFS Backlog
- East Coast: high import volume is causing equipment shortages, lack of available truckers, all resulting in pick-up delays



West Coast

The west coast sees the most imported goods from Asia than any other U.S port because of the increased demand, LA/Long Beach, Oakland, and Seattle are at more than double their capacity. There are more than 70 vessels - accounting for approximately 500,000 containers waiting on the coast of California. The ability to remove cargo from port terminals is an outstanding issue, as rails hubs, warehouses, and storage facilities become increasingly more crowded.

- Los Angeles: 8-15-day vessel wait time
- Long Beach: 10-15-day vessel wait time
- Oakland: 1-2-day vessel wait time
- Seattle: 25-30-day vessel wait.
- BNSF & UP/LAX/LGB BNSF: Containers average wait time of 16 – 18 days before being picked up
- Seattle: 25-30-day vessel wait.
- Seattle Rails: Containers average wait time of 10 days delay due
- West Coast: Severe trucker shortage - truckers are booked for 2 weeks – 3 weeks out
